Today, AST is a leader in designing, implementing, and supporting technology-based solutions for its customers as they look to compete in the omni-channel and Internet space.

"AST is a company that helps other companies work smarter," said Mound Business Park President Eric Cluxton. "They have proven themselves to be experts in their field, able to thrive as technology changes, and we know they'll continue down that path from the Mound."

Actual cadavers were used in the training, which creates a much more realistic environment, and as a result, produces more effective training for the K9s.

Firefighter/Paramedic Nicholas Fathergill with Region 3 Strike Team was instrumental in bringing K9 Solutions, Inc. to Miamisburg to host this national training event. When he reached out to the Mound Business Park, President Eric Cluxton and team agreed to donate the space for this important work.

"The multiple environments present at the Mound made it possible for us to create a dynamic training environment for our students," said Fathergill. "Not only were they accommodating, the Mound also helped us keep the costs down with their generous donation of the space needed."

The Mound plans to welcome K9 Solutions, Inc. back to the Mound early next year.
